The institution also carried out an Internal Audit under the instruction of the mother university which also provides a lot of information..

Remedial classes and Coaching for entry in services are going on; Because of greater intake in B.A General, provisions have been made in the routine for extra sections by expanding the instructional hours. GB applies for introduction of Education once again.

Annual system of evaluation is in vogue. The College is following the Three Part Evaluation System in accordance with academic calendar. Performances of the students are conveyed through parent teachers meet.

One MRP has been completed, Two teachers have been guiding research scholars.

Two rooms are under construction under the financial assistance of MPLAD grant. Large amount of money has been spent in upgrading the computers and to provide adequate number of books in the library.

The college is managing all affairs both academic and administrative, in spite of acute dearth in human resources. All the faculties and support staff are over-burdened. Casual staff and guest lecturers are recruited as per administrative and academic requirement.




